#### Glossary. Performing Arts in Context - Dynamic Practices, Static Terms

#### Salzburg, May 5th - 8th

**Conference Report** 

As a presence-follow up to the meeting in Cork (2019) the conference "Glossary. Performing Arts in Context – Dynamic Practices, Static Terms" took place May 5th – 8th 2021 at Mozarteum, Salzburg.

#### Wednesday, 5th

A total of 16 delegates from a broad variety of countries have made it to the conference in Salzburg – either already for the opening or arriving short after.

The following days were dedicated to working together in, as Ulrike Hatzer put it in her opening words, in fact two conferences (live and digital) with two main, a sub and a meta-topic each.

Following up the conference in Cork one topic was working on an ongoing and ongrowing glossary for the field. Thus the first two days consisted of a Keynote by Babafemi Folorunso, Country Reports with a focus on East Europe as well as a presentation of the "Festival of Walking Terms" as an example of an idea of doing an open glossary.

The second half was dedicated to the founding of PUC PAC – Permanent University of Performing Arts in Context and thus an inter- and transnational network for the field.

This at the same time constituted the subtopic of this conference – both in terms of content and very practical design regarding hierarchies, accessibility and organisational structures: How in times like these can we work in international networks and transnational cooperations? How can we learn from postcolonial theories and bring them directly into action?

In this the setup and questions were intervowen with the meta-topic: assymmetrie. The list can surely be expanded beyond questions of representation in different times and contexts, different aspects of working in the field, in different spaces, access to situations where something is to be decided in oder to go on, in order to work further.

Assymmetries in which we nontheless cannot freeze – but gathered for this conference in terms of credibility and visibility; believing in the relevance and importance of (the presence of) the communities and topics we work with.

So ahead layed four days of experimenting, of being in the trouble together, of working in the middle of a global pandemic – seeing what can be learned from the situation and how it can be put into direct action; seeing this as an oportunity of ongoing work – but also as a pitstop between the meetings in Cork and Zurich.

Next Dr. Babafemi Folorunso delivered the keynote "Arts and society – clarification of a few points" via Zoom out of the lockdown in Edinburgh, sharing reflections around keywords that might be deemed essencial to any coming glossary in the field. Basing the talk on the notions of solidarity, Babafemi Folorunso touched on questions of stability, equality, citizenship, human potential and racial diversity, urgently connecting the conditions of making art with democratic conditions and measures as well as the concept and practice of citizenship and challenging racist status quo.

The keynote was followed by a lively discussion both in the physical and digital space.
